CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Okay. Good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. name is Council Member Daniel Dromm, and I'm Chair of the Committee. We are joined this morning by Council Member Francisco Moya, Council Member Adrienne Adams, Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer, Council Member Andy Cohen, Council Member Steve Matteo, and Council Member Barry Grodenchik and others will be here shortly. Today, the committee will be voting on five items, one transparency resolution and four Article XI property tax exemptions. First, we have the Transparency Resolution, which sets forth a new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local, aging and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk. As with all transparency resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict of with this,

2 with any of the groups on the attached list. Council member has a potential conflict of interest 3 with any of the organizations listed, he or she has 4 the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time 5 of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any 6 7 conflicts you have with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. 8 These disclosures must be made before the 9 subcontractor can be approved. Benjamin Smith from 10 the General Counsel's Office is here and can assist 11 12 you with any questions or concerns regarding disclosures. Next, we have the land use items that 13 would approve Article XI Property Tax exemptions to 14 15 preserve or construct affordable housing. The first is 241 West 111th Street in Council Member Perkins' 16 district in Manhattan, which would provide a full 40-17 18 year exemption to preserve 19 units of co-op housing. The second is 505 West 43rd Street in the Speaker's 19 20 District in Manhattan, which would provide a full 40year exemption to construct nine units of co-op 21 housing. The third is 316 East 91st Street in 2.2 23 Council Member Kallos' district in Manhattan, which would provide a partial 40-year Article XI Property 24 Tax Exemption to construct 18 units of rental 25

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- 2 housing. The fourth is 1010 to 1014 Hoe Avenue in
- 3 Council Member Salamanca's district in the Bronx,
- 4 which would provide a partial 35-year exemption to
- 5 | preserve 31 units of affordable housing. All of the
