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Sergeant-at-Arms: Test, test, this is a test. Today's date is March 28, 2019. This is the Committee hearing on Finance being recorded by Sergeant-at-Arms, Evan [phonetic] Lopez.

CHAIRPERSON DROMM: [gavel] Okay, good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. My name is Council Member Daniel Dromm and I'm the Chair of the Committee. We've been joined by Council Member Andy Cohen, Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer, Council Member Keith Powers, Council Member Francisco Moya, Council Member Adrienne Adams, Council Member Barry Grodenchik and Council Member Steve Matteo. Today the Committee will be voting on seven items, an expense budget modification, a revenue budget modification, two resolutions to approve the Council's fiscal 2020 operating budget, a transparency resolution and two Article 11 property tax exemptions. Let's start with the budget modifications. The first modification is an expense budget modification that represents movements of approximately \$1.8 billion of funding between and within City agencies to implement expense budget changes which were reflected in the February 2019 financial plan. The second is a revenue budget

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modification that recognizes \$868.5 million in new revenues and combines \$400 million of prior year payables and \$1.4 million from the general reserve implementing changes reflected in the February 2019 financial plan. Of these funds the total amount of \$2.65 billion is added to the budget stabilization account which will prepay debt service for fiscal 2020. The third and fourth items are the Council's fiscal '20 operating budget which totals \$87.6 million. This is divided into \$65.3 million for personnel services and \$22.3 million for other than personnel services. The next is the transparency resolution which sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk. As with all transparency resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the

2	groups on the attached list. If any Council Member
3	has a potential conflict of interest with any of the
4	organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity
5	to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote.
6	As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may
7	have with proposed subcontractors used by
8	organizations sponsored by discretionary funding.
9	These disclosures must be made before the
10	subcontractor can be approved. Benjamin Smith from
11	the general counsel's office is here and can assist
12	you with any questions or concerns regarding
13	disclosures. Lastly, we have the two Article 11
14	exemptions. The first is 369 E. 8 th Street in
15	Council Member Rivera's district in Manhattan which
16	would receive a full 32 year exemption to preserve 29
17	units of affordable housing. The second is Glendale
18	Apartments in Council Member Holden's district in
19	Queens which would receive a partial 40 year
20	exemption to preserve 72 units of affordable housing
21	and we do have somebody who wants to speak before we
22	vote. That is Felice Rosner and I want to welcome
23	her and ask her to come up to the witness table and
24	to speak.

2	FELICE ROSNER: Good morning everyone.
3	I'm a resident at 368 E. $8^{ ext{th}}$ Street in Manhattan and
4	I'd like to read a letter that we've prepared to
5	present to you. Dear Chairman Dromm, we understand
6	that our request for an Article 11 exemption is on
7	the Finance Committee's calendar for this Thursday as
8	File number T2019-4022. We, the Board members and
9	tenants of 368 E. 8 th Street HDFC request the support
10	of the New York City Council towards our Article 11
11	property tax exemption application which has been
12	submitted and is pending the Council's approval. Our
13	Council Woman, Carlina Rivera, supports our request
14	as we have shown her that we are reliable,
15	responsible and trustworthy in our commitment to
16	preserving our building as an affordable housing
17	resource as we have for 40 years. Our building's
18	members reflect the diversity of the lower east side
19	in age, race, creed and sexual orientation. There
20	are owner members who have grown up in our building
21	and have lived their entire lives here. Our building
22	was a force for stability during decades of neglect
23	and crime in our neighborhood. HPD is also
24	supporting our request for an Article 11 property tax
25	exemption. We have worked closely with this agency

2	to apply for a green housing preservation program,
3	GHPP, loan for the building's rehabilitation and will
4	be signing a new regulatory agreement upon closing.
5	We appreciate your consideration to this matter and
6	look forward to your support and approval. Thank
7	you.

9	We have your testimony here written as well and we're
10	gonna have that on file. I thank you for coming in
11	to give testimony. All right, are there any
