Seventeen of these bill pertain to tenant displacement. In May of last year, the New York Times ran a three-part series that highlighted the lengths that landlords will go to remove rent regulated tenants and to bring those apartment units up to market rate. In the aftermath of this article, we held a hearing on those 17 bills. The final bill relates to construction site safety training. Proposed Intro 59-A, which I sponsored would ensure that tenants entering into buyout agreements do so as educated consumers. This bill will require that the person offering a buyout agreement inform the tenant of the median asking price for similar units as well as factors that may impact the tenant's ability to rent an apartment if they choose to-if they choose to This bill also requires HPD to report on median asking rents in each community district if sufficient data is available.
