CHAIRPERSON BORELLI: Good morning everyone out there in the audience. I'm Council Member Joe Borelli, and I'm Chair of the Committee on Fire and Emergency Management. I'm joined today by my colleagues Council Members Cabrera and Brannan. Both nice guys, by the way. We're here today to vote on legislation related to the reporting on presence of smoke detectors or alarms and automatic sprinkler systems following serious fire incidents. Currently the Fire Department is required to report on information related to the technology and operations of smoke detectors or alarms following fires that result in civilian fatalities. Proposed Intro 826-A sponsored by Council Member Justin Brannan will expand these reporting requirements to provide the public with more information related to the presence and operations of life-saving technologies in serious fires. First, the bill would expand existing reporting requirements related to smoke alarms or detectors to now include all fires that cause civilian fatality or a life threating injury. Additionally, the bill requires new reporting on the presence of an activation of automatic sprinkler
