Chair. I would like to thank Chairs Avella and Katz and the members of the staff of the Zoning and Land Use Committees as well as Speaker Quinn, Land Use Staff Gail Benjamin and Amy Levitan who have been incredibly wonderful in respect to this issue. I want to thank the Commissioner, Commissioner Burden, Borough Commissioner Puna Makapoor and the staff at City Planning, and Commissioner Oster of HPD and the staff for working with me.

I would especially like to thank

Community Board 7, its Chair Randy Pierce, local residents and community groups who today we have some with us which is as far as Ginny and Tom

Murphy who are here, are life-long residents and Reverend Cressbow who is the President of Clergies for Justice.

I thank you all, the local residents, community groups, who addressed our concerns about new development in Sunset Park that was inconsistent with the existing built character. This is a serious problem throughout the City but particularly in our community as

development pressure has moved south from Park

Slope and north from Bay Ridge. In the past years

we have seen rents skyrocket and long-time

community residents get pushed out of our

neighborhood.

More recently buildings have been constructed which have not been affordable to local residents and have been out of scale with the rich architectural history and unique character of Sunset Park. I am pleased to have Sunset Park join other neighborhoods throughout the City that have undergone a contextual rezoning.

Our rezoning for 120 blocks in Sunset Park will seek to preserve the neighborhood character and scale by placing height limits throughout the area. It also promotes sensible new development where appropriate at a height and scale that is in keeping with the existing context.

The plan will support local retail corridors and create opportunities for affordable housing through inclusionary zoning. I also wish to acknowledge and commend City Planning's

commitment to study the 8th Avenue corridor in

Sunset Park immediately following the conclusion

of the ULURP process.

Administration's commitment that community preference will be applied to greater than 50% of any new affordable housing units built in Sunset Park. Affordable housing is a very serious issue in my District. HPD and City Planning have agreed to keep the community apprised of new affordable housing in our District. Together we will facilitate and ensure that all available information is obtained by all interested parties.

I share concerns about displacement and harassment of tenants. I understand that many of the units are in rent stabilized buildings and must comply with Department of Housing Community Renewal. Local Law 7 also provides tenants being harassed by landlords by giving them tools to seek relief in Housing Courts. HPD has committed to work with me to continue to directly educate my community and work with local nonprofit groups on anti-harassment policy.

I love Sunset Park. I grew up in

Sunset Park. For generations, four generations of my family live in Sunset Park. Certainly I have a vision for our neighborhoods but I never believed it was my right to impose that vision on the residents. That is their right. That is their job.

The residents of Sunset Park have worked long and hard on this rezoning. The grand mosaic that is Sunset Park came together to provide the input that fashioned this plan. I provided outreach and assistance to all the neighborhoods of Sunset Park in the hope that they would unite in a common vision.

I simply offered help to increase visibility on the issue and provided any help requested to coordinate efforts or navigate bureaucracies. I am pleased that the prestigious Pratt Center for Community Development matched the funding I put forth to conduct an independent analysis and develop a series of three widely attended workshops to first explain the rezoning process and then seek community input from a wide array of Sunset Park residents.

My door was always open. Otherwise

2	I deliberately kept a certain distance away from
3	any meetings, hearings or deliberations so my
4	vision would not influence the final outcome.
5	Oftentimes change is difficult. And some people
6	lack the vision necessary to accommodate change.
7	I realize that there will often be
8	opponents to a major rezoning such as this one but
9	I believe it is in the best interests of the
10	community to see this move forward and to have the
11	new development be in scale with the existing
12	neighborhood and to begin to provide incentives so
13	our neighbors can continue to call Sunset Park
L 4	their home.
15	I urge all my collages to vote yes
16	on this plan. Thank you.

I know you had other pressing matters, to listen to the testimony that was presented at the hearing. I found the testimony, and I'm not--I can't say that there is no one who feels the way you described, but those that came to testify, many of them had what I felt

2 I think it was pretty clear if you would watch 3 the, what is it Channel 74 whenever it comes up, a political and personal motive to come and testify 5 and say what they said. Most of the testimony had 6 nothing to do with the rezoning. It had to do 7 with Sara Gonzalez being wonderful or not 8 wonderful or this or that or the other thing. the Mayor being wonderful or not wonderful or not 9 wonderful, whatever else. So all I'm saying is 11 that at the hearing itself, we usually find that 12 the people who feel most strongly about an issue 13 come to testify. Those that don't, and there may 14 be others that don't but those that certainly 15 presented whatever they had, feelings, to me it 16 seemed like very clear that it was very personal, 17 nothing to do with the rezoning. It had to do 18 with whether they like or don't like the Community 19 They don't like the elected official. 20 They don't like this or that or the other thing. 21 And I feel, based on the testimony, not about 22 other things, that this is a wonderful rezoning. 23 I didn't find that in the testimony at all any 24 real clarity as to there not being enough 25 outreach, enough hearings, enough meetings
