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Sound check for the Committee on Health being recorded by Israel Martinez June 25, I believe, let me just double check that, June 25, 2019 taking place 16th Floor, Committee Room and that's about it, scheduled for 11 a.m.

CHAIR LEVINE: Hello everyone. Welcome to this hearing on the City Council's Health Committee. I am Mark Levine, Chair of the Committee. Pleased that we are joined by fellow Committee Members Council Member Inez Barrow, who is our bill sponsor, Council Member Keith Powers, Council Member Bob Holden and Council Member Andy Cohen. Today we are considering Intro Number 5. That is not a typo. Intro 5 because Council Member Barron is so speedy or perhaps her legislative director, Indigo Washington, and submitted this at 12:01 a.m. on January 1, 2018. Our topic today, however, is serious. This bill is part of our continuing fight against obesity and diabetes, fights that we have unfortunately stalled in. Of late, more than half of adults are overweight or obese in New York City and nearly half of elementary and preschool age children also suffer from obesity or are overweight and we have to do more and we have to get people information so that they

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can manage their diet effectively and today's bill will do just that by requiring signage in restaurants to inform people of the health impact of sugar and carbs and unless one of my colleagues is in an enormous hurry, I'm gonna que our bill sponsor, Council Member Barron, for her statement, please.

COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Thank you, Mr. Chair and thank you to the Committee members. This is a very important bill and the idea for this bill came from my legislator director who has great interest and concern about not just diabetes but prediabetes and the fact that so many of our people who are in that state actually don't even know so what we want to do is to let people know they may have forgotten in their physiology that carbs turn to sugar at that digestive process and they may not be associating what they're eating as carbohydrates is in fact increasing the sugar intake and the added sugar that exists in so many products so what this bill called for is information that restaurant keepers will be required to post so that people will be aware that excessive carbs and sugars can be contrary to good health outcomes and have them aware that the administration was involved in having us be

2	mindful that we don't want to bombard the patrons
3	with a lot of signs but this is an important issue.
4	The Department of Education will design the content
5	of the poster and restaurant keepers will be advised
6	of this when they are visited and they will be told
7	that this is a requirement and if they don't have it
8	at the time of the first visit, they will be allowed
9	a year to be able to implement it without any type of
10	penalty so we're very mindful of that as well so I
11	want to thank my colleagues for supporting this bill
12	and thank you for bringing it to the Committee for a
