Good morning. My name is Costa Constantinides and I am Chair on the Committee on Environmental Protection. This morning we are joined by committee members Rafael Espinal from Brooklyn, Steve Levin from Brooklyn, and, on my right, Council member Donovan Richards from Queens and Council member Eric Ulrich from Queens. Today we will hold a vote on a bill and on a resolution designed to protect our climate. This includes a cleanup of Intro 1253 C known as the Climate Mobilization Act and resolution 864 A calling for a declaration of a climate emergency. 1253 C was the largest reduction of carbon policy ever in any city. By calculations, will be the equivalent of taking more than 1 million cars off the road by 2030 and creating measurable decreases in nitrous oxide, sulfur oxide, and particulate matter that foul our air and contribute to higher than average asthma rates. It will put our biggest and dirtiest buildings on a path of me being

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Under section 36 of the New York City Charter, the bills that we vote on at a stated meeting of the Council are required to be laid on the desks of the members seven days prior to the adoption by the Council, exclusive of Sundays. items were not laid on the desk of the members of the Council. I know that because, when we walked in here on Wednesday, the last day for laying bills was Tuesday night, there was nothing on the desks of the members of the Council. That's just not-- not just my opinion, but you can check the Wednesday video of the stated that we had here in the Chambers of this Council and you'll see that the members desks had no papers on them. That's not because the member's desks just had no papers on them. I assume nobody broke in here in the middle of the night and stole the papers off the desks of the members, it's because the bills were not properly laid. So, when a bill is not properly laid, I don't believe it's properly

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before the Council. My suggestion would be to report this— these two items out of the committee and to have them placed on a stated agenda for a future stated meeting, hopefully the next one because they are two very important items. However, they will not be properly before the Council today. So I will vote age on both items on the couple of the items on the agenda, Mr. Clerk, but I will not be able to vote on them today at the stated. Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman.
