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ISRAEL MARTINEZ: Sound check, July 23, 2019, the Committee on Finance, being recorded by Israel Martinez, taking place Committee Room, City Hall, scheduled for 10:00 a.m. [pause]

CHAIRPERSON DROMM: [gavel] Thank you. Good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. My name is Council Member Daniel Dromm and I'm chair of the committee. We've been joined this morning by Council Member Vanessa Gibson, Council Member Francisco Moya, Council Member Robert Cornegy, Council Member Keith Powers, Council Member Helen Rosenthal, Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer, and Minority Leader Steve Matteo. Today the committee will be voting on six items: A transparency resolution and five Article 11 property tax exemptions. First we have the transparency resolution. The transparency resolution sets forth the new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local, aging, and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in the resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the council,

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or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk. As with all transparency resolutions, council members will have to sign a disclosure form, indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed he or she has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved. Benjamin Smith from the general counsel's office is here and can assist you with any questions or concerns regarding the disclosure. Next, we have the land use items. The first three relate to the Putnam portfolio in Council Member Ayala's and Perkins' districts in Manhattan. Collectively, the three partial 40-year Article 11 property tax exemptions would preserve 1084 units of affordable rental housing across four properties. Those four buildings are the Heritage, River Crossing, the Miles, and the The fourth is St. Anne's Apartments in

Council Member Ayala's, Gibson's, and Salamanca's
districts in the Bronx, which would provide a full
40-year Article 11 tax exemption to support the
preservation of 87 units of affordable rental
housing. The fifth is 603 Pontiac Place in Council
Member Ayala's district in the Bronx, which would
make a technical amendment to a prior resolution
approving an Article 11 property tax exemption. All
of the council members and the relevant districts are
supportive of these actions. For specific details or
each of these projects please see the memorandum
prepared by the finance division staff, which is
available online on the council's website and part of
the official record. Those are all of today's items.
Are there any questions? OK, I will now ask Billy
Martin, committee clerk, to call the roll. I see that
we've been joined by Majority Leader Laurie Cumbo
also.
