CHAIRPERSON DROMM: [gavel] OK, good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. My name is Council Member Daniel Dromm and I'm chair of the committee. We have been joined by Majority Leader Laurie Cumbo, Council Member Adrienne E. Adams, Council Member Helen Rosenthal, Council Member and Minority Leader Steve Matteo, Council Member Barry Grodenchik, Council Member Keith Powers, and Council Member Rory Lancman. Today the committee will be voting on five items, a transparency resolution and four Article 11 property tax exemptions. First we have the transparency resolution. The transparency resolution sets forth a new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local, aging, and youth discrepancy funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in the resolutions that have not yet

completed their prequalification process conducted by 2 3 the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the council, 4 or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk. As with all transparency resolutions, council members will have to sign a 6 7 disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict 8 exists with any of the groups on the attached lists. If any member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed he or she has 10 11 the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time 12 of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any 13 conflicts you may have had with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by 14 15 discretionary funding. These disclosures must be 16 made before the subcontractor can be approved. 17 Benjamin Smith from the general counsel's office is 18 here and can assist you with any questions or concerns regarding disclosures. Next, we have the 19 20 land use items. The first is Harlan House in Council 21 Member Perkins' district, which would provide a 2.2 partial 40-year Article 11 tax exemption to support the preservation of 212 units of affordable rental 2.3 housing. The second is Owensville Manor in Council 24 Member Torres' district in the Bronx, which would 25

provide a full 32-year Article 11 tax exemption to 2 3 support the preservation of 46 units of affordable 4 limited equity home ownership. The third is 340 South Third Street in Council Member Reynoso's district in Brooklyn which would provide a full 40-6 7 year Article 11 tax exemption to support the preservation of 41 units and their conversion to an 8 affordable limited equity co-op. The fourth is a technical amendment to a prior exemption granted by 10 the council to Council Member Cabrera's district 11 in the Bronx. All of the council members and their 12 13 relevant districts are supportive of these actions. 14 For specific details on each of these projects please 15 see the memorandum prepared by the finance division 16 staff, which is available online at the council's 17 website and part of the official record. But before 18 I call for the vote, I want to take a moment to thank 19 someone who has been very important to the finance 20 division and to me personally in my role as a Council 21 Member, chair of the Education Committee, and that's 2.2 Caitlyn O'Hagan, who is sitting over there. I want 2.3 to thank her for her service, her last day [applause] will be tomorrow and she has served faithfully in the 24 council for the last five years. First, and I forgot 25

this, she served with Council Member Vanessa Gibson
and she was the budget director there, as well as the
senior financial analyst covering education in the
finance division and I worked very close with her
when I was chair of the Education Committee, and I'm
very grateful for all of your service there as well.
But, you know, she is going on to good and better
things. She will be pursuing a Ph.D. at NYU in
educational policy, so she is continuing down that
path, and we congratulate you and thank you for all
of your service here at the City Council. Thank you,
Caitlyn, very, very much. [applause] All right. And
with that, those are all of today's items. Are there
any questions? All right, seeing none, I'm going to
now ask Billy Martin to call the roll.
