CHAIRPERSON CORNEGY: Good morning. Good morning everyone and thank you for coming. I'm

Council Member Robert Cornegy, chair of the council's

Committee on Housing and Buildings. Council Member

Richards? You're disturbing my hearing.

COUNCIL MEMBER RICHARDS: You're acting real short today.

We're here to hold a vote on proposed Intro 30-A, sponsored by Council Member Chin, which relates to the recovery of tenant relocation expenses. When a building's owner negligence or failure to maintain a property results in unsafe living conditions and the issuance of a vacate order, HPD has the authority to relocate displaced tenants and recover associated expenses. However, recovering these expenses can be

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difficult for HPD, in large part because they're currently assessed against the building as a low-3 priority mechanic's lien. Proposed Intro number 30-A 4 5 would discourage building owners negligence and strengthen the ability of HPD to recover relocation 6 7 expenses by instead imposing a high-priority tax lien through which HPD can more effectively pursue 8 repayment. I'm joined today by Council Members Farah 9

Louis, Ritchie Torres, Bill Perkins, Francisco Moya,

Barry Grodenchik, and Carlina Rivera, and my 11 12 colleague and the bill's sponsor has a statement.

13 COUNCIL MEMBER CHIN: Thank you, Chair.

I'm proud to join the Committee on Housing and Buildings to vote on my bill, Intro 30-A, which will serve as a groundbreaking new tool to hold the city's worst landlord accountable to the burden that tenants experience as a result of a vacate order and get them home sooner. This bill will require the Department of Housing Preservation and Development to create a first of its kind system to charge landlords for temporary relocation costs by requiring landlords to pay up for the temporary housing for residents displaced by a vacate order. This bill will ease the burden on displaced families, hold bad landlords

accountable for their repeated offenses against
tenants, incentivize landlords to complete the
require repair work faster so that tenants can return
home as soon as possible. As our city continue to
face an unprecedented affordability crisis we have to
work creatively and aggressively to hold negligent
landlords accessible and break down the pipeline to
the shelter system. No longer can landlord take a
back seat to the suffering they have caused to
tenants displaced by a vacate order. The buck has to
stop here. I thank all the lawyers and analysts at
the central staff for their work on this bill and
thank you, Chair Cornegy, for your support and
leadership, and for HPD for your partnership. I urge
all my colleagues to vote yes on the bill. Thank
you.
