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CHAIRPERSON CORNEGY: [GAVEL] Good morning everyone and thank you for coming. I'm Council Member Robert Cornegy; Chair of the Council's Committee on Housing and Buildings.

We're here to hold the vote on four bills today.

Three related to housing lotteries and one related to construction safety.

Housing developments that receive tax abatements, exemptions, or other forms of public funding contain units set aside for individuals who fall within specific area median income bands and household sizes.

Individuals can get leases for these units by entering house lotteries and for many individuals getting a lease for one of these units can be akin to winning the lottery. Many lotteries receive upwards of 70,000 applications.

Although, some New Yorkers do receive housing through these lotteries, the process is frequently fought with complaints. These include complaints that the selection process is opaque and that there is a lack of clarity about who exactly is receiving units in these developments. Similar complaints have been made about Mitchell Lama housing developments.

Through the bills we will voting on today, are

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Proposed Intro. Number 550-A, sponsored by

Council Member Levine will require the Department of

Housing preservation and development to report on the

housing lottery process including reporting on

implementation, challenges and technical

difficulties, complaints, procedures for further

processing and selecting applications and procedures

for filling waiting lists. This will allow us to

better understand the problems with the housing

lottery process, so that it can be improved upon.

Proposed Intro. 564-A sponsored by Council Member Treyger would require HPD to report on who receives housing through housing lotteries. The report would include information about application demographics such as race, household size and area median income.

Proposed Intro. 716-A, sponsored by the Public

Advocate will require HPD to report on Mitchell Lama
housing development waiting lists, including
complaints about these waiting lists. Having this
information would allow us to improve the
effectiveness of Mitchell Lama waiting lists.
