2	CHAIRPERSON FOSTER: Good	morning.
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This is Council Member--this is Council Member.

Good morning. This is the Parks and Recreation

committee meeting. I'm Council Member Helen Diane

Foster. We've been joined by Council Member Tish

James from Brooklyn. We're going to hear on

proposed Intro 1083-A, our first witness is Sheila

Feinberg for New Yorkers for Parks.

SHEILA FEINBERG: Good morning.

Thank you for holding this hearing. New Yorkers for Parks is the independent organization dedicated to ensuring that all New Yorkers have access to a world class system. Transparency and community involvement—

We applaud this proposed

legislation for working to expand the levels of
accountability and transparency in the management
of our public parks. As evidenced by recent
issues throughout the city, more transparency is
needed in the governance of our parks. Intro

1083-A attempts to increase local accountability
by mandating that at least one individual who
resides or whose place of business is within each
Council district in which a park is located or

2	abut,	must	be	a '	voting	member	of	the	Board	of
3	Direc	tors	of t	he	respec	ctive p	ark	cons	servano	гу.

We support this principle and feel that community involvement and representation is essential towards improving the efficiency, equity and efficacy of public/private partnerships in parks. As always we have some recommendations.

We have several recommendations regarding the most recent version of the legislation. This bill would only affect conservancies that have written agreements with the city and that are responsible for hiring the majority of the full time staff operating the park. Few groups fall within both of these categories.

According to the 2007 Citizens
Budget Commission Report, commissioned by New
Yorkers for Parks, Making the Most of our Parks,
only 10 of the 40 plus conservancies in the city
have written contracts and fewer than this hire
the majority of their full time staff. We believe
there could be value in increasing the number of
conservancies that are held accountable to this
legislation and this should be explored further.

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2	Finally, we commend the inclusion
3	of joint consultation between Council Members and
4	the Parks Department to determine the local
5	representative of the conservancy. However, we
6	recommend that the community board also be

7 included in the process. In addition, we would

like clarification on how rotating of local

9 representatives would take place when more than

10 two Council districts represent the park. Many

large parks with conservancies about multiple

12 Council districts that have widely varying

demographics and it is important to ensure that

all groups are fairly represented.

In conclusion, while some public/private partnerships make it a priority to include community members, broader legislation is needed. Community involvement is too often seen as an afterthought or even a barrier in many Parks operations. This bill allows for members of the local community to take an active role in the oversight of their public park. Local leadership and participation in the decision making process is vital towards increasing transparency, stewardship and community ownership in our public
