SERGEANT HOPE: Good morning, and welcome to the Committee on Health. All members and staff please turn on your video and please, place all electronic devices to silence. Chair, we are ready to begin. Thank you. Sergeant. Good morning everybody. I am Mark Levine, Chair of the City Council's Committee on Health, and I'd like to acknowledge my fellow Health Committee Members who are with us this morning including Council Member Andy Cohen, Council Member Bob Holden, Council Member Alicka Ampry-Samuel, Council Member Keith Powers and I believe that Council Member Inez Barron as well, although...Oh, and there she is. Excellent. Thank you all so much for joining us today as we will be voting on Preconsidered Proposed Introduction Number 1961-2020-whose lead sponsor is Council Member Ritchie This is a Local Law in relation to public Torres. reporting on contact tracing. New York City's Contact Tracing Program is by far the largest and most complicated undertaking the city government has had to manage in this crisis. It is also incredibly high stakes. There simply is no safe reopening without this public infrastructure in place. Contact

2	tracing only works if the public buys in. If the
3	public trust, this program is willing to participate.
4	That's why it is critical that we have full
5	transparency and reporting throughout this process.
6	That's exactly what Preconsidered Intro 1961 would
7	do. Specifically, it will require reporting on the
8	number of employees and languages and zip codes of
9	employees in the Contract Tracing Program, the number
10	of people identified by the program who have tested
11	positive for currently having COVID-19, and the
12	context of such people disaggregated by zip code,
13	race, ethnicity, gender, age range, COVID-19
14	symptoms, whether such persons have been referred to
15	wraparound services, occupational setting and co-
16	morbidities, and this reporting will be required on a
17	daily basis. So, I strongly encourage my colleagues
18	to vote in favor of this bill. Thanks again to
19	Council Member Torres for introducing it, and thank
20	you all aging for being here with us today, and I
21	believe now I cancan queue Committee Counsel, Billy
22	Martin to call the roll.
