12 delivered by the Reverend Dr. Robert M. Waterman, the  
13 administrative Bishop and spiritual leader at Antioch  
14 Baptist Church located at 828 Green Avenue in the  
15 heart of Bedford-Stuyvesant Brooklyn.

16 SPEAKER JOHNSON: Is the pastor there?

17 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: You have to unmute  
18 yourself, Reverend Waterman.

19 REVEREND WATERMAN: Yes. Can you hear  
20 me?

21 SPEAKER JOHNSON: Yes.

22 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Yes.

23 REVEREND WATERMAN: Okay. Once again,  
24 we just want to thank all of you for the work that  
25 you have been doing for our community. Let us pray.

2 Our eternal, everlasting Father in heaven, some call  
3 you supreme God and others call you Elohim, Jehovah,  
4 and other Allah. It is our request that you would  
5 bless this Council. We desire that Your divine  
6 presence would be here with us today. Among other  
7 things, oh, God, you are the creator of the human  
8 mind, which you model in some fashion after your own  
9 great mind. Though we acknowledge that your thoughts  
10 are infinitely higher and more profound than ours, we  
11 glory in the notion that we may, on our own level,  
12 think some of our thoughts after you in this way.  
13 Father, we thank you for the precious gift of  
14 knowledge and discovery. May our efforts be blessed  
15 with insight, guided by understanding and grant us  
16 wisdom. We seek to serve with respect for all,  
17 though we are still in the middle of various  
18 pandemics and we still recognize that you are still  
19 in control. May our personal faith give us strength  
20 to act honestly and well in all matters before us.  
21 Bless today with chance of growth, with friendship,  
22 and sense of community. With work to do and the  
23 leisure to enjoy. Let us be a positive influence on  
24 those we meet. May we act with integrity and truth  
25 in all things giving the very best of ourselves in

2 all that we do, living in appreciation of your gift  
3 today. I ask on behalf of those who are gathered  
4 here today, that you would bless us. Give us the  
5 grace that makes a difference for the good wherever  
6 that we may find ourselves in here today and now may  
7 you be pleased with what is done here today. Thank  
8 you for your presence. In the name above all other  
9 names, I pray, in Jesus' name according to my faith,  
10 Amen.

11 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Amen.

12 COUNCIL MEMBER CORNEGY: Amen.

13 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Amen. Thank you,  
14 Reverend Waterman. I would now like to ask Council  
15 member Robert Cornegy to spread the invocation on the  
16 record.

17 COUNCIL MEMBER CORNEGY: Good afternoon  
18 and thank you, Madame Majority Leader. Dr. Robert M.  
19 Waterman is a graduate of Drew University where he  
20 obtained his Doctorate degree, New York Theological  
21 Seminary Master of Divinity, a Bachelor's Degree from  
22 Hunter College, political science degree, and  
23 Associates Degree in public administration from  
24 Eugena Maria de Hostos Community College of City of  
25 New York. A recipient of the Bells Delos [sp?]

2 scholar and New York University scholarship, All  
3 American Academic Team Dean's List, college  
4 scholarship, talent roster and Phi Theta Kappa. A  
5 life member of NAACP and, dare I say it, Kappa Alpha  
6 Psi fraternity, incorporated, which we still do not  
7 hold against him. Dr. Robert M. Waterman has served  
8 as assistant to the Vice President and Dean of  
9 Student Affairs and Medgar Evers College and conduct  
10 officer for three years. He served as a director of  
11 Teen Service Corps in the Officer of Career  
12 Management Office where Dr. Waterman recruits  
13 students for the CUNY Service Corps to interview and  
14 participate in the cohort of students who will serve  
15 as ambassadors for the institution and CUNY.  
16 Students bridge the gap between the classroom and  
17 workforce. Students contribute to advancing the  
18 mission of the specific service organization and  
19 learn the value of civic engagement. Now, going into  
20 his fifth year, he is serving as the Career Manager  
21 and Officer of the Medgar Evers Career Management  
22 Services. He served as a substitute teach in the  
23 Department of Education for six years in District 16.  
24 Dr. Robert Waterman, pastor of Antioch Baptist  
25 Church, located in the Bedford Stuyvesant area for 19

2 years. He worked in the engineering field for over  
3 20 years before going into education. Dr. Waterman  
4 is actively engaged in the fight against issues such  
5 as poor education, poverty, lack of jobs, and limited  
6 healthcare. He serves as the president of the  
7 African-American Clergy and Elected Official  
8 Organization of Brooklyn for the last 10 years. Dr.  
9 Waterman serves as the Chair of the Trustee Board of  
10 Interfaith Medical Center and Vice Chair of the  
11 Trustee Board of One Brooklyn Health, Interfaith,  
12 Brookdale, and Kings Brooke Jewish Medical Center.  
13 He served on Community Board three for over 10 years  
14 and serves at District 16 Diversity Committee for the  
15 Department of Education in District 16. I don't know  
16 when Dr. Waterman sleeps. I'm actually tired just  
17 reading that bio. No. But Dr. Waterman has been a  
18 tremendous service and has been a community pastor  
19 for a very long time and is the go-to person for  
20 spiritual guidance for many residents of Bedford  
21 Stuyvesant. I'd like to now have the-- have his  
22 words read into the record. Thank you.

23 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Thank you. And I  
24 would also like to call on Council member Inez  
25 Barron, who also would like to join you, Council

2 member Cornegy, in spreading the invocation onto the  
3 record.

4 COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Thank you, Madame  
5 Majority Leader. I just wanted to take this occasion  
6 to echo the comments that have already been read into  
7 the record and to just say that Pastor Waterman has  
8 done so much for the community and for Medgar Evers  
9 College and for individual people, as well, and has  
10 made many sacrifices and we continue to think him for  
11 the leadership that he provides and wish him and his  
12 family well. Thank you so much.

13 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Thank you so much,  
14 Council member Barron, as well as Council member  
15 Cornegy. We will now go into the adoption of  
16 minutes.

4 PARLIAMENTARIAN: Mr. Speaker, point of  
5 parliamentary order, I believe there were no minutes

14 243, expense budget changes for fiscal year 2020.

15 SPEAKER JOHNSON: Finance.

16 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Petitions and

19 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Land use call ups?

21 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Thank you. We will  
22 now have communication from Speaker Corey Johnson.

23 SPEAKER JOHNSON: Thank you, Madame  
24 Majority Leader. Our purpose together this morning  
25 is brief. This morning, the Committee on Finance met

2 and favorably reported for our consideration two  
3 technical resolutions that are necessary to close out  
4 the fiscal year that ends today. We will meet later  
5 today to vote on the items necessary to adopt the  
6 fiscal 2021 adopted budget, but in order to give the  
7 city comptroller enough time to effectuate the  
8 transfers of funds necessary to close out fiscal  
9 2020, we are voting on these two items this morning.  
10 The first resolution is an expense budget  
11 modification which represents movements of  
12 approximately 4 billion dollars in funding from  
13 various agencies and 1.8 billion dollars to various  
14 city agencies to implement fiscal 2020 expense budget  
15 changes including reallocations of appropriations  
16 that were included in the fiscal 2020 budget to fund  
17 Council local initiatives. The second resolution is  
18 a transparency resolution that sets forth a new  
19 designation. The changes in the designation of  
20 certain organizations receiving local, aging, and  
21 youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant to  
22 certain initiatives in the budget. Since we're  
23 meeting later today, in the interest of time, I ask  
24 that member please hold their remarks on the fiscal  
25 2021 budget until we vote on those items. Again,



2 this is just voting on two technical changes so the  
3 comptroller can close out the fiscal 2020 budget  
4 year. With that, Madame Majority Leader, I turn it  
5 back to you.

6 MAJORITY LEADER CUMBO: Thank you, Speaker  
7 Johnson. We will now move into discussion of general  
8 orders. If you wish to speak, please use the raise  
9 hand function in Zoom.

23 [inaudible 00:21:12] that we represent the 51,

24 realize that we are doing this modification, the last

25 one, for the 2020 at a point in time in history where

2 we have inherit a society that, unfortunately, has  
3 not been focusing on closing the gap in the city of  
4 New York. That this should be the last budget that  
5 we should approve that should not be focused on  
6 serving the most [inaudible 00:21:53] community.  
7 Speaker Johnson and all of us who should be proud to  
8 move our budget, to move the agenda the most we can,  
9 but unless we realize that our white Council member  
10 has privilege in the areas that they serve in, then  
11 we will not be voting on this modification  
12 understanding that there's a lot more that we've got  
13 to do. So as we are voting today, I also hope that  
14 for the few hours, everyone here realize that George  
15 Floyd, coronavirus, show the reality of how we've  
16 been spending money in the city of New York. Black,  
17 Latino, Asian, poor, has not been priority, as it  
18 should be and, as we are adopting this modification  
19 today, I hope that we also can put a strong  
20 [inaudible 00:22:52] on sharing the privilege that  
21 certain districts have over the poorest ones in the  
22 city of New York. With that, I vote aye.
