Chair Salamanca, we are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: All right, thank
you. So, ah, [gavel] good morning. Um, I am Council
Member Rafael Salamanca, chair of the Committee on
Land Use, and I am joined remotely today by Council
Members Adams, Reynoso, Grodenchik, Rivera, Deutsch,
Ayala, Chair Moya, Barron, Koo, Lancman, um, Diaz,
and Gibson, and Chair Adams. Um, I want to thank
Chair Moya and Chair Adams for their work on our
zoning and landmarks subcommittees. Today we will
vote on a number of applications referred out of
these subcommittees. But before we begin, I would

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2 like to recognize the committee's counsel to review
3 the remote meeting procedures.

COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Thank you, Chair Salamanca. I am Julie Lubin, counsel to the committee. Council members who would like to ask questions or make remarks should use the Zoom raise hand function. The raise hand button should appear at the bottom of the participate panel. I will announce council members who have questions or remarks in the order that they raise their hands. Chair Salamanca will then recognize members to speak. I would like to remind council members and the public that there may be extended pauses if we encounter technical delays. We ask that you please be patient as we resolve any technical difficulties that may arise. Chair Salamanca will now continue with today's agenda items.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Thank you, thank you, Counsel. Today we will vote to approve LUs 678 and 679, ah, the 59-14 Bay Parkway rezoning relating to property in Council Member Yeger's district. The application seeks a zoning map amendment to change an R5 district to an R6/C2-4 district and a zoning text amendment to map a mandatory inclusionary housing

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area on the east side of Bay Parkway between 59th and 60th Street, with MIH option 1 and 2 and the work force option. The proposal will facilitate the development of a nine-story mixed use building with ground floor retail, community facility use, and residential use. We will also vote to approve five items submitted by the Department of Housing Preservation and Development. LU 666, the Weeksville NCP is an application submitted pursuant to Article 16 of the General Municipal Law and 197-C of New York City Charter for the designation of an urban development action area, an Urban Development Action Area Project and the disposition of property to a developer selected by HPD for property located at 1559-1563 Prospect Avenue, Brooklyn, in the council district represented by Council Member Ampry-Samuels. LUs 667 and 668 concern the 641 Chauncey portion of the Old Stanley Project. LU 668 was submitted pursuant to Article 16 of the General Municipal Law and Section 197-C of the New York City Charter, for the designation of an urban development action area, an Urban Development Action Area Project, and for the disposition of property to a developer to be selected LU 667 was submitted pursuant to Article 11

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of Private Housing Finance Law, requesting an exemption for real property taxes for the disposition area. Both items relate to property located at 641 Chauncey Street, Brooklyn Council District 37. 669, the Old Stanley 2, was submitted pursuant to Article 16 of the General Municipal Law and Article 11 of the Private Housing Finance Law. application, HPD requests approval of an Urban Development Action Area Project, waive of the designation requirement of Sections 197-C and 197-D of the charter, and an exemption from real property taxes for property located at 676 Central Avenue and 1277 DeKalb Avenue, Brooklyn, in Council District 34, which is represented by Council Member Reynoso, and Council District 37, which is vacant. LU 670, Open Door Bed-Sty Central in North 1 was submitted pursuant to Article 16 of the General Municipal Law and Article 11 of the Private Housing Finance Law. HPD requests your approval of an Urban Development Action Project, waiver of the designation requirements of Section 197-C and 197-D of the charter and an exemption from real property taxes for 16 properties located in Brooklyn in Council District represented by Council Member Cornegy. We will also

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2 vote to approve three items submitted by the 3 Landmarks Preservation Commission pursuant to Sections 3020 of the City Charter and Sections 25-303 4 of the administrative code. LU 671, the proposed rescission of the landmark designation of Beth 6 7 Hamedrash Hagodol Synagogue of 60-64 Norfolk Street in Council Member Chin's district in Manhattan. 8 landmark no longer exists as it was destroyed by fire. LU 672 is an amendment of the landmark 10 11 designation of the Alexander Hamilton House, also 12 known as Hamilton Grange, to mark as landmark site 414 West 141st Street in Council Member Perkins's 13 14 district in Manhattan. LU 673 is an amendment to the 15 landmark designation of Kingsland Homestead to make its landmark site 143-35 37th Avenue in the district 16 17 represented by Council Member [inaudible]. Members 18 of the committee and members representing affected 19 districts who have questions or remarks about today's 20 items should use the raise hand button. Now, Counsel will announce members in the orders that the hands 21 2.2 were raised. Any members wish to make any comments 2.3 or statements? All right. So, ah, seeing none, I now call for a vote in accordance with the 24

recommendations of the, I'm sorry.

3 Reynoso has a comment or a question.

CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: I didn't, OK, um, Council Member Reynoso, I'm sorry, Council Member, I didn't see your hand.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNOSO: It's cool, Chair. How are you? Hope you're doing well. Glad, glad to see everyone on the, on the call. I wanted to speak to the 5914 Bay Parkway rezoning before we get to a vote, um, instead of explaining it on my I wanted to make sure that I, ah, talked to members before, before the vote. Ah, this, ah, project is looking to, ah, change the district from R5 to R6 and in doing so using a work force option. We're talking about, ah, allowing for one-bedroom to be rented out at \$2500. Ah, and we have an adjacent, ah, or not an adjacent, another application that's being done in a black district, um, or a district represented by a black member, um, that is doing 100% affordable housing, ah, for a one-bedroom under \$1000. Um, and the one that's, ah, a one-bedroom for \$2500 is, is in a white affluent district. And what we're doing here is continuing to, ah, perpetuate the segregation and the burden of building all the

2 affordable housing in our city to black and brown 3 minority districts. Um, it's exhausting all of our 4 resources. The burden of the development of all the affordable housing, getting people out of homeless 5 shelters, continuing to fall on the backs of, ah, 6 7 black and brown districts. At some point, ah, we need to get serious about dealing with affordable 8 housing and not allowing for members, ah, that are in districts that are affluent and white, um, ah, 10 11 escape, at this point escape, ah, to the 12 responsibility of, of taking care of the greater 13 Um, if you are in a district that has built affordable housing, especially the ones in South 14 15 Bronx, southeast Queens, central Brooklyn, which continue to be the leaders in building affordable 16 housing, um, we're at a loss here. Um, and this is 17 18 gonna continue. And, again, I just want to make sure that I, I communicate that the work force option, 19 20 it's a one-bedroom for \$2500 a month. That does not, 21 um, assist or support anyone in my district or anyone 2.2 in homeless shelters from getting an apartment. 2.3 doesn't, the greater good is not achieved here. Thank you for giving me the opportunity to speak, and 24 I hope that, um, my members will look twice at, ah, 25

COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Ah, thank you, Mr. Chair. I just wanted to comment. I support the comments made by my colleague, Council Member Antonio Reynoso, and I wanted to just comment additionally on item 670. It's a project located in Community District, ah, Community Board 3 neighborhood, where 29% of the population is considered severely rent burdened. And I went on ANHD to see what the, ah, what the demographics were for that community, and the poverty rate there is 27%. There's been a decrease in the population from 2016, no, from 2018 to 2019, a decrease of 23%. And there's also similarly been a decline in the poverty rate of 3 percentage points and I wondered about that and tried to make, ah, an understanding of how that happened. And what happened was that there was a significant increase in the white population. So it's not that the black population that presently lives there was able to find jobs and able to gain employment, but that another population came in, displacing the

3	poverty rate. The homes that are being offered in
4	this project, three-family home, will range from
5	\$677,000 to \$804,000. That's way beyond the reach o
6	the majority of the population that's there and for
7	me that means that that population would be, ah, not
8	eligible to apply for the program and in fact there
9	would be additional displacement of the black
LO	population. So for that reason I'm voting no on Land
L1	Use 670, 678, 679, and any accompanying resolutions.
