SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank you and good morning, everybody, and welcome to today's remote New York City Council hearing of the Committee on Governmental Operations. CHAIRPERSON CABRERA: Good morning. I am
Council member Fernando Cabrera, Chair of the
Committee on Governmental Operations. I am pleased
to be joined together by my colleagues Yeger, Kallos,
Perkins, Barron, Cornegy, Grodenchik, and Powers.
Today, the committee will hold a vote on two pieces
of legislation that will include public access to the
laws and rules of the city and improve the process of
the city agency rule making.

Proposed introduction in 1874A, sponsored by Council member Chin, will permit individuals to

Proposed introduction 1878A, sponsored by Council member Powers, will amend the City Administrative Procedure Act or COPA. Currently the rule making process under COPA can take a long time. Local laws often include a provision that authorizes

receive notification which will help them select the

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right agency.

COUNCIL MEMBER KALLOS: I just wanted to speak in favor of Introduction 1874A. The city record is the most important newspaper in the city of New York that no one has ever heard of. It comes out every single weekday and it's the way the city will tell you whether or not they're going to bulldoze your house to build an intergalactic highway. it's the equivalent of having a [inaudible 00:04:39] centuri. For those of you wondering what I'm talking about, it's Douglas Adams and the Hitchhiker's Guide, one of my favorite books. And so, last term we were able to put the City Record online, but it is still very tense. The system does allow for people to subscribe to specific notices. This legislation, which is introduced by Council member Chin, which I am a co-prime sponsor, will codify the notification requirement and make it easier for people to keep track of the things that matter to them. So, I am happy to vote in favor of that as well as
