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the time saying that it was a bait and switch or that this was never really going to happen. That we were rebuilding new jails and we weren't going to close Rikers Island that it was the jail expansion plan. And just for the record, everyone should know that the capacity on Rikers Island is around 20,000 or more beds in the borough based jail plan is, I believe, around 4000 beds. In but at the time, you know, the integrity of this body and of that vote was called into question and I am grateful that we are at this point now where we can say affirmatively through legislation that Rikers Island is going to close and that we are looking forward into the future for future generations by planning a renewable resource for energy so that our city can be powered and not relying--

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Time expired.

COUNCIL MEMBER LEVIN: And I will just conclude right now. On dirty electricity or fossil fuels, but could, in fact, be powered under its own volition through renewable sources. And it is a very important thing that we are doing this today and that this legislation has come to pass and so I wanted to just acknowledge the work that everyone has done on

Before I vote, though, I raised my hand earlier, if I 10 11 could ask some questions for the Chair. I think some 12 things are important for people to know. Can I ask 13 some questions? 14 CHAIRPERSON CONSTANTINIDES: Sure. 15 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Time starts now. 16 COUNCIL MEMBER MENCHACA: Thank you. 17 So, the first thing is I was in a personal meeting 18 yesterday and someone brought up the concept of NYCHA 19 on Rikers and I think it would be great for the Chair 20 of this Committee who is really kind of pushing these 21 pieces of legislation that I support just to let 2.2 everybody know that none of these bills include 2.3 housing or bringing housing to NYCHA. It would be a

great thing for you to clarify. That is one.

CHAIRPERSON CONSTANTINIDES: I think that these bills, and no way,, guarantee anything. These bills would guarantee that we get the Department of Corrections off of the island. These bills will have a study for sustainability and resiliency purposes and study our energy plan. And I think bringing any housing to— and this is me going as a personal—this is me just saying that it would be very complicated to put housing on Rikers Island being that it is built on ashen garbage and there are methane leaks. So I think that would be very complicated.

think it is just an important thing for our New
Yorkers to hear, as when I heard this I was
perplexed. The other question is, if the Mayor wakes
up tomorrow where there is a new administration,
which is going to happen soon, and the city scraps
the four borough jails, the legislation that we are
really passing today will not be impacted at all.
That it will move in perpetuity separate and apart
from the four borough jails. And I think that is an
important thing to clarify here today.

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Corrections has to leave Rikers' Island.

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2 CHAIRPERSON CONSTANTINIDES: As I said
3 before, these bills in the law and being sent by no
4 later than August 31st of 2027, the Department of

COUNCIL MEMBER MENCHACA: Great. So I think that's another really important component. So, with that, I want to explain my vote and say, thank you, Chair, for the incredible work that you have done as leader of this committee.

much of what this Council has done is move the conversation from—— and I'm going to associate some of my words with Council member Levin, but not all of them, and say that we did move the needle on this question on whether or not we should close Rikers and it changed minds. Our discussions and the Council and the debates that we had internally and externally really changed the mood about Rikers and I think where we failed was approving four borough jails. That is the failure of this Council and I think that what I think is important here is that this committee

is really looking forward to creating a real vision
for something that is better for Rikers. Rikers is
still open today. The concept of a pretrial cage is
wrong and so I just want to, as I approve with my
vote on this committee, say yes to these bills and
more work needs to go back to the really right the
wrongs because, as I have learned and I become more
really radicalized around the idea that we have to
abolish these spaces that we warehouse and cage our
New Yorkers before they even get convicted. In
Rikers and these four borough jails really represent
that. So, I'm really excited to be testing this
about to really bring a whole new vision allow for
leadership to rise again. Thank you so much, Chair.
I vote aye.
