OKAY. Good afternoon everyone. Welcome to today's remote New York City Council vote of the Committee on Education. At this time would all panelists please turn on your video. To minimize disruption please place electron devices to vibrate or silent. Thank you for your cooperation. Chair Treyger, we are ready to begin.

CHAIR TREYGER: Good afternoon and welcome every one to today's Committee on Education, a vote on Resolution Number 1473 sponsored by Council Member Louis. This resolution, which I am proud to have signed onto as a co-sponsor calls on the New York City Department of Education to provide families with children with disabilities the necessary training and equipment to properly enable distance learning. Before we hear from Council Member Louis I'd like to just say a few words. This is the... Last year we chaired this committee. In the last three years this committee has held numerous hearings on students with disabilities and a myriad of challenges they face in the New York City public

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school system representing nearly 20% of the public school population time and time again at education hearings we have heard from students parents and advocates that we are not fully meeting the needs of the students, and that was before the pandemic. The DOB has made strides in providing all services students are held to under their IEP, but we are not there yet. We are not at a place where students with disabilities have all the tools and resources they need in order to have a full and free education as all students are entitled to under law. COVID has only exacerbated the problem and I fear it's put us backwards on gains made. When COVID hit and the DOB opened up rec centers I advocated early on that students with disabilities should be prioritized for When the DOB ordered 300,000 plus I-Pads placement. I advocated for the priority of distribution to students with disabilities in addition to other types of devices not just Ipads. In formulating my own ideas for school reopening I have ideas for students with disabilities to be amongst those at the front of the line when buildings reopen. We can and must do better for our students with disabilities and their families. Resolution 1473

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calls on the DOE to ensure that families with students with disabilities have all the resources they need to successfully support their children during this time of distance learning, and I encourage all my colleagues to please join us in doing this. I want to thank my staff and committee staff, and I will now turn it to Council Member Louis and I really appreciate her leadership and her attention and time to kids who need support and I really always appreciate her centering then as well, and I turn to Council Member Louis for her remarks.

COUNCIL MEMBER LOUIS: Thank you so much Chair Treyger for the opportunity for my bill to be voted

advocacy for educational equity in a city as diverse

during the pandemic. So, thank you so much. My bill
Resolution 1473 puts the focus on children with
disabilities, a group of individuals who have been
overlooked and ignored for a very long time.
Children with disabilities comprise more than 20% of
New York City public students, and each of their
unique circumstances must be accounted for to ensure
that they are able to get the most out of their

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Families with children with disabilities education. are still struggling to cope with the difficulties of distance learning which was exacerbated even further by the additional needs of their children. Many of these children need individual professional support with learning, and this role has not fallen into the hands of parents who have received little or no training nor support that is critical in ensuring education equity for their children. it's about time that we tackled this issue and we cannot continue to permit the most vulnerable members of our community to fall behind, our children. Your vote today will provide much needed relief for families of children with disabilities. Once again, thank you Chair Treyger for your support and I hope everyone supports this bill today. Thank you.
