New Needs in the 2021 Adopted Plan

HUD/SDNY Agreement Investments



- **\$279 million** to address the main pillars of the HUD administrative agreement
- **\$311 million** for new needs in 2021, primarily due to expenses related to central office needs and property services.

New Expense Spending in City FY22 Executive Budget

- **NYCHA Disaster Relief Funding.** \$20 million added in Fiscal 2022 to balance NYCHA outyear disaster relief funding.
- **NYCHA Cleanup Corps.** \$7 million added in Fiscal 2021 and \$16.7 million in Fiscal 2022 as part of the City's Recovery For All plan.
- **NYCHA Tobacco Spending Plan.** \$1 million added in Fiscal 2021 for outreach to mitigate smoking related issues at NYCHA developments.
- **Roll unspent NYCHA LMDC.** \$2.6 million rollover of funding from the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation from Fiscal 2020 into Fiscal 2021
