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CHAIRPERSON LEVINE: [GAVEL] Good morning, and welcome to this hearing of the City Council's Health Committee. I am pleased that we are joined by our colleagues on the Health Committee; Council Member Powers, Council Member Diaz, Council Member Powers, Council Member Diaz, Council Member Powers, Council Member Ampry-Samuel, and Council Member Holden. I'm Mark Levine Chair of the committee. Oh, do you want to be acknowledged as well Council Member Yaeger? Alright, thank you. We're thrilled to have you here too.

We are going to be voting today on a piece of legislation Intro 1668 which will be an important advancement in our effort to get every person in this city access to primary medical care. This is an imperative coming out of this pandemic and quickly I'll explain that this bill would ensure that every community of this city has a site where people who are uninsured can access the NYC Care Program.

This is a program designed for people who are uninsured, primarily it's people who are undocumented, but there are others as well and it provides them a primary care home, a clinic with a primary care doctor, a place to get their annual physical, a place to get check-ups, preventative

screenings, vaccinations, referrals to specialists.				
Uh, it's a program that has uh, uh, a helpline				
people can call, uh, access to pharmacy assistance.				
Uh, it is available on a sliding scale regardless of				
ability to pay. It is available regardless of				
immigration status, but until now, it has not been				
available in every neighborhood because the program				
is only uh, offered out of health and hospital				
facilities and we love the H&H system, but there are				
many, many neighborhoods throughout this city that				
do not have an H&H facility and we need to offer				
people in those communities an opportunity to get				
health care, primary care in their neighborhood by				
activating the amazing network of community health				
centers known as FQHC's.				

Just in this committee I was chatting before uh, in Brownsville Council Member Ampry-Samuel has a community with no H&H facility but a great FQHC. Her constituent's there should be able to access NYC Care from there.

Council Member Powers has faraquaways again, another community where there are a significant number of uninsured people and uh, no, no H&H facility, but again a great FQHC there that could

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serve as the home for this program. Uh, and we can 3 go on and on siting neighborhoods throughout the city and this bill will solve that problem by requiring the city to bring in those community 5

health centers into the NYC Care Program. 6

So, with that introduction, I think I'm going to pass it off to our Committee Clerk to call the roll for the vote. Mr. Martin please.

COMMITTEE CLERK: Sure. William Martin Committee Clerk roll call vote Committee on Health proposed Introduction 1668-A. Chair Levine?

CHAIRPERSON LEVINE: Uhm, I'm going to be voting aye and just, just very briefly uh, I will be offering uh, extremely effusive praise of the people who made this happen in uh, the stated meeting, but uh, I don't know if he's in the room now, but I have to shout out Lewis Cholden-Brown who uh, worked over seven years to bring this bill across the finish line. Uh, it's just extraordinary what he's done. We certainly wouldn't be here today without his efforts, so uh, wherever you are Lewis thank you and I will be voting Aye.

COMMITTEE CLERK: Ampry-Samuel?

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COUNCIL MEMBER AMPRY-SAMUEL: Thank you so much

Chair for all of your hard work on this bill and as

you said in your openings remarks, I am very excited

to actually see this happen because I know that the people in the 41st Council District will really be able to benefit in addition to BMS, which is our FQHC, so thank you so much and with that I vote aye.

COMMITTEE CLERK: Holden?

COUNCIL MEMBER HOLDEN: I vote aye.

COMMITTEE CLERK: Powers?

COUNCIL MEMBER POWERS: Aye. Congratulations to the Chair, Chair Levine for the passing of this important bill.

COMMITTEE CLERK: Diaz?

I also vote aye, but I also thank the Committee for working on this as a New York City individual who did not have health care for several years and reached out to the city for medical coverage. 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COUNCIL MEMBER BROOKS-POWERS: I also vote aye and commend the Chair as well as the Committee Staff who are working on this important bill. Uhm, health care and access to quality health care is something that uhm, I have advocated for many years especially in my community where we uhm, unfortunately do not have enough access to quality health care coverage and I think what this bill sets out to do uhm, to be able to provide greater access is critical. And I look forward to working with you Chair uhm, in your role now as well as in your future roll to be able to advocate for more services in my district which include Rockaways, but also uhm, Rosedale, Laurelton, and Springfield Garden. So, thank you so much. I vote aye.
