**Whereas**, bills have been introduced in the New York State Legislature by Senators Marchi, Morahan, Padavan and Trunzo, S.2234-B, and Assembly Members Lavelle, Seddio and Weisenberg, et al, A.1349-C, “AN ACT to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to extending the benefits of the variable supplements fund to all New York city police officers, firefighters, housing police and transit police”; and
