#### By Council Members Brannan, Hanif, Yeger and Won

A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the placement of temporary priority regulatory signs at intersections within one hour of a report of an inoperable traffic control signal

#### Be it enacted by the Council as follows:

Section 1. Subdivision e of section 19-128 of the administrative code of the city of New York, as added by local law number 22 for the year 2014, is amended to read as follows:

- e. Within [twenty-four hours] <u>one hour</u> of receiving notice that a traffic control signal is missing or damaged to the extent that such signal is not operational or visible to a motorist who must obey or rely upon such signal the department shall <u>place a temporary priority regulatory sign at the location of the missing or damaged traffic control signal</u>. Within 24 hours, the department shall:
- (i) repair or replace such signal, at which point the department may remove the temporary sign if applicable,
- (ii) implement <u>additional</u> alternative measures to control traffic if such repair or replacement will take [greater] <u>more</u> than [twenty-four] <u>24</u> hours, or
- (iii) make a determination that repair or replacement is not warranted, at which point the department may remove the temporary sign.
- § 2. This local law takes effect 180 days after it becomes law.
